## Our Impact

Each year, through our acute intervention and transitional services:

Over **6,200** victims and their children receive direct services

Over **4,700** victims receive crisis legal advocacy and critical support services immediately following a domestic assault

Over **3,200** victims receive civil and family court advocacy services and information

Over **600** victims are assisted in securing Orders for Protections (OFPs)

Over **8,000** calls for support, information, and referrals on our 24- hour crisis line

Over **5,800** victims and their children receive critical transitional services in meeting their basic and long-term needs

Our strong partnerships with community-based and government agencies have an enormous impact on victims' and their children's safety, abusive persons' accountability and opportunities to change, and the way our community responds to domestic violence.
